# **Exciting New Sport Options**



Swansea High School offers a range of overseas cultural Exchange programs. If you are interested see the Administration Office for more information.


# Learning to Lead Day

# 2017 Sport Options Yr 9 & 10, Term 1

### Surfing - \$10 per week.

Note: Swimming is not included as part of this sport

Students must be willing to participate in their selected sport for the <a href="ENTIRE TERM">ENTIRE TERM</a>. Sport choices <a href="will NOT">will NOT</a> be changed during the term. Please select your sport carefully, taking the price into consideration. Please note that the venue cost is weekly paid to the venue. ALL bus payments must be finalised by Week 3. Students who do not have their venue money on the day and/or full sport uniform will attend sport detention.

## Sports detention

Students who are unwilling to follow the school's sports policies and procedures are allocated a sports detention as a consequence. Sports detention runs during sport time and students are given work to do as a consequence for poor behaviour at sport. Sports detentions may only be issued by the sports coordinator or a member of the school executive. Parents/caregivers will generally be contacted when a student is allocated a sports detention. Further consequences may be issued for serious offences at sport or for persistent misbehaviour which results in several sports detentions during any given school term.
